FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Are you comfortable with your faith? What do you find interesting or exciting about your relationship with the Lord? That might seem like an odd question, but I've been thinking more and more about the conversations we have with the people in our lives.

What do you usually talk about with the people who are in your life? You talk about things that you are comfortable with. Things that you have knowledge of and the things that are important to you. You might talk about the Packers, the weather, or your favorite restaurant. Or you might talk about things that excite you or interest you.

For example, you just learned some interesting information regarding financial planning or a restaurant where you had an outstanding experience. You share it because it is helpful to the person you're talking with. They will now know how to plan for their future better, or they will know where to get a tasty bite to eat.

So, that brings us back to the original questions: What about God makes you interested, comfortable, or excited? Because what we talk about starts with our experience. Second, it continues with the good things we want to share with other people. When we experience good or interesting things in our lives, we share them with the people around us.

As I examine my own life and engage in conversation with fellow church members, I find a common theme: we don't share these things about faith with others unless we are in the confines of the church. Why is that? We don't keep things that we are comfortable with, excited about, or interested in other areas of our lives from our friends and acquaintances. But when it comes to our relationship with the Lord...we often don't.

No judgment here! This is a pattern I'm noticing in my own life. So take a moment with me and reflect on your life. What is holding you back from having more conversations about your faith with your friends? And in particular, people in your life who don't have a relationship with Jesus. Spend some time in prayerful self-reflection and ask God what needs to be different in your life. And maybe, as the disciples did in the book of Acts, pray that the Holy Spirit would bring boldness to your life so that you would share the good news and hope of the Gospel with the people that you know.

There is a short book our GMC conference recommends, which our leadership team has gone through, called "Pray and Go." This is a helpful resource we will use in our bible studies and small groups in the new year. If you'd like to go through it yourself before we start in groups, please contact Nate or Jan.

One Sure Guide

Our thoughts seem to be consumed with one thing lately - the elections. No matter how things turn out - whether the candidates you and I vote for win or lose - one thing is sure, God is still in control, and He is still on His Throne. He won't be taken by surprise. Always keep in mind, there is only "One Sure Guide" as Christians. God is our authority, and our compass is the Word of God.

In the midst of a thousand different voices, all claiming their own authority and clamoring for our allegiance, only one Voice will tell us the truth. That Voice? The written Word of God, given to us by God to tell us what we are to believe and how we are to live. As the Psalmist said in **Psalm 119:130**,

"The unfolding of Your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple."

There are so many voices clamoring for our attention and allegiance these days. Voices trying to get to us, but there is only one sure guide in an unsure world: The Bible. Is it your guide?
